

The Fremont Burger & Brew Fest is making a comeback and we couldn't be more excited. Celebrating the craft brew movement the Annual Fremont Burger & Brew Fest returns to Downtown Fremont on Saturday, May 21st from 11:00am to 5:00pm.

This celebration of artisan delights will feature a mouth-watering selection of gourmet burgers and craft beers from Bay Area breweries and food trucks. The day-long celebration will also include live music, local business booths, arts and craft vendors, and gourmet market snacks and treats. An exciting new addition this year is the artisan spirits tasting area with offerings from the finer distilleries in the Bay Area.

The Burger Throwdown - a cooking competition that pits local celebrity teams against each other returns with four teams manning the grill to create the most mouthwatering burger. The winning team takes home the perpetual trophy and earns a \$250 donation to the charity of their choice.

Attendance is free and open to the public. Tasting Packages and Extras can be purchased in advance online at burgerandbrewfest.com. A beer tasting package is \$45 which includes a 4-oz. branded glass for unlimited tastings. For an additional \$20 you can upgrade your experience to a beer and spirits tasting package which includes the 4-oz. branded glass for unlimited beer tastings and entrance into the spirits area which allows two tastings per distillery.

This year's Festival has drawn local support from the City of Fremont, NBC Bay Area, Meta, and Star One Credit Union.

CHAMBER HIGHLIGHTS 2021-2022

THE FREMONT CHAMBER CONTINUES TO MEET WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO ADVOCATE FOR CHAMBER MEMBERS AND OUR COMMUNITY

Over the course of the past nine months, the Fremont Chamber of Commerce has embarked on a new initiative to promote innovation and entrepreneurship in the City's business community to our statewide officials. These visits and tours have given local business owners the opportunity to directly interact with statewide officials and share their accomplishments, frustrations, and concerns.

July 2, 2021: CA Lt. Governor Eleni Kounalakis toured Enovix Corporation and Tesla, Inc. Enovix Corporation is a 3D Silicon Lithium Ion battery manufacturer. Following the tours, Lt. Governor Kounalakis had a working lunch with business owners representing various industries. Business owners discussed their feedback of COVID-19 restrictions and the State of Californias systems put in place to support businesses, labor issues, and the overall environment of doing business in California.

March 7, 2022: CA State Treasurer Fiona Ma toured Owens Design where she learned how the company supports the manufacturing needs of emerging markets that introduce new technologies and innovative products. Afterwards, the Treasurer visited ALOM and learned how this supply chain manager balances sustainability with speed of delivery. Lastly, Treasurer Ma toured DasBrew Inc., a local brewery, and learned how the owners turned their hobby and passion into a successful community business. At the conclusion of the tours, the Chamber hosted a small business roundtable where local business owners were able to engage directly with Treasurer Ma who took questions and shared remarks about resources available to support businesses.

April 21, 2022: CA Attorney General Rob Bonta toured retail businesses in Fremont, discussing organized retail crime and public safety. Joined

by Fremont Police Chief Sean Washington, the Attorney General also held a roundtable discussion with small business owners for a discussion about CADOJ's work to enhance public safety and our shared priority of ensuring that California remains the best place to live, work, and shop.

Additionally, on March 2, 2022, the Fremont Chamber of Commerce hosted newly appointed SBA Regional Administrator, Elmy Bermejo, visited ICE Safety Solutions, Gridscape Solutions, and held a lunch with small business owners. Regional Administrator Bermejo had discussions to understand the successes and difficulties faced by businesses and learned about the entrepreneurial spirit in Fremont.

At the Fremont Chamber of Commerce, we understand the importance of directly connecting the business community to our elected representatives. These tours and discussions give elected officials a first hand account of how the business community is doing and seeing their successes and challenges first hand. These visits allow elected officials to make more informed policy positions that have an immense impact on businesses of all sizes in California. BURGER & BREW FEST: CELEBRATING CRAFT BEER AND SPIRIT MAKERS FROM CALIFORNIA

The Burger & Brew Fest was created to celebrate the variety and quality of craft breweries in northern California. With over 1,100 across the state, California is by far the leading producer of craft beer in the United States. In fact, according to the California Craft Brewers Association, California is the birthplace of the American craft brewing movement. Did you know...

- 95% of California residents live within 10 miles of a brewery
- The total economic impact from 2020 was \$9.66 Billion
- 65,158 full-time jobs exist as a result of the craft brewing industry
- On average \$10-\$15 Million is donated to charity each year by craft breweries
- 3,356,134 barrels of beer was produced in 2020 by craft breweries

Now, what constitutes "craft" you ask? Well it definitely depends on who you ask and what type of craft alcohol we're talking about, but

here are a few rules we like to go by at the Burger & Brew Fest...

- They Keep It Small Craft beverages are typically produced by a smaller company and often those companies are independently owned.
- They Put Quality Over Quantity It's not about who can produce the most, it's about who can produce the best. Care and time goes into making the best craft beverages and so craft markers often produce a smaller quantity than larger corporations.
- They Innovate Creativity prevails in this area of the industry. Craft brewers put their unique twist on historic styles in order to create new styles.
- They Care About Their Customers Consumers of craft beverages care about
 the experience and craft makers know it.
 They tend to be involved in their
 communities whether it be through
 donations, volunteerism or



participation/sponsorship of local events (like the Fremont Burger & Brew Fest!)

While the Burger & Brew Fest started with just craft brews in mind, the event has since grown to include a craft spirit tasting option. According to the California Craft Distillers Association the number of active California craft distilleries hit 190 last year, up from just 118 in 2015. With that kind of growth we felt it was high time we branched out to include more of the craft beverages community in our event.

So, do we have you convinced to give craft a try? The 7th annual Burger & Brew Fest will be held on May 21st, 2022 from 11am to 5pm and will feature sampling from bay area breweries and distilleries. We'll also be serving up mouthwatering burgers and sliders, and we'll have gourmet snack vendors, local business booths, art and craft vendors, as well as live entertainment, including The Burger Throwdown - a burger cooking competition.
