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## Downtown Fremont: The Place to be this Summer and Fall



Fremont Street Eats takes place in downtown Fremont

#### **Downtown Fremont**

Returning for its third season in Downtown Fremont, Fremont Street Eats is open every Friday through October on Capitol Avenue between Liberty and State streets from 4:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. Visit the food trucks and get ready to experience eclectic flavors from a variety of gourmet offerings outside City Hall's doorstep.

Summertime will also be filled with all your Fremont favorites such as the Fremont Festival of the Arts on August 1 and 2 and the Festival of India on August 15 and 16. Heading into fall, be sure to catch our Downtown Date Night on Capitol Avenue and Liberty Street for an outdoor film event on September 18. But the fun doesn't stop there—get your kids decked out in costumes for a spirited Halloween event on October 23 to round out the season.

Downtown Fremont—it's the most happening place to be this summer and fall!

#### Phase I of Capitol Avenue, Nearing Completion in Fall

Phase I of the Capitol Avenue Extension Project will be nearing completion this fall. The project kicked off last September with the Downtown on the Rise Demolition Celebration, where the community was able to witness the demolition of a three-story office building, allowing for the connection of Capitol Avenue to Fremont Boulevard. This fall, the community

will see a transformed, multi-modal street that will include bike lanes, free public parking, a landscaped median, and 10-15 foot sidewalks with street trees and additional landscaping. The new multi-modal street set to serve as Fremont's 'Main Street" involves more than just grading and paving. The new extension includes unique screen walls that will enhance the pedestrian experience. Utilities placed underground will power electric vehicle charging stations. In addition, concrete poured to form wide sidewalks will create a pedestrian friendly vibe and allow for sidewalk cafes. And finally, landscape will provide shade and create an inviting environment for residents and visitors alike.

Phase II of Capitol Avenue improvements will commence after the completion of Phase I, focusing specifically on Capitol Avenue between State Street and Paseo Padre Parkway. Improvements will include installing street furniture such as benches, seat walls, recycling and trash receptacles, streetlights and signs, etc., and enhanced landscaping. This portion

of the road will be open to traffic throughout the construction phase and is estimated to be completed in early 2016.

The City is currently planning a grand opening event to occur in the fall to celebrate the work completed in Phase I. Stay tuned to the City of Fremont's social media websites at www.Fremont.gov/SocialMedia for more details!

# The Chamber and Downtown Fremont

When formed in the 1950s, the Fremont Chamber of Commerce was envisioned as a unifying city-wide organization. In contrast to other local organizations that serve one specific area of Fremont, the Chamber's concern is the quality of the business environment throughout Fremont. This focus on civic life quality is why we are so active in downtown Fremont.

From weekly Street Eats events to special occasions like the Festival of the Arts and the Burger and Brewfest, the Chamber is committed to working with the City of Fremont and the larger community to activate downtown Fremont into a vibrant district with residents, businesses and happenings occurring on a regular basis.

Fremont Street Eats: Every week, nearly 1,000 residents from Fremont and the surrounding areas stop by Capitol Ave at Liberty St for dinner. Along with the Food Truck Mafia, the Chamber hosts this event to bring life and energy to a quiet street in what will be a bustling downtown district in the near future. At Street Eats this summer, you can see the new Capitol Ave extension coming into focus between State St and Fremont Blvd. From there, new mixed use developments will be built and, eventually, a new civic center. Regular Street Eats attendees will see the incremental changes in our downtown as the summer moves forward.

Fremont Festival of the Arts/Burger and Brewfest: Both the Festival and the Burger and Brewfest draw visitors to downtown Fremont but function in a slightly different way. Instead of a weekly visit, these annual events draw hundreds of thousands of people to Fremont. Many attendees are not regular visitors and come from all over the Bay Area. These events are opportunities for our city to showcase itself.

# Safety and Security at the Festival of Arts

It is the Fremont Police Department's mission to provide the safest environment possible for those who wish to enjoy the Festival of the Arts. During the two-day event, Fremont police will be on-site providing security for the Fremont Chamber of Commerce. Should you need any assistance during the event, please look for a uniformed police officer or Fremont VIPS volunteer.

We strongly encourage event attendees to pre-plan their transportation to and from the event. A designated Taxi pick up/drop off area will be located at Walnut Avenue and Civic Center Drive. In addition, please be cautious when driving in the area and be on the lookout for pedestrians, as this event is expected to draw approximately 300,000 people throughout the course of the two days.

"If you see something, say something." During the Festival of

Arts, or any other Fremont event, we ask that community members always be aware of their surroundings and report suspicious activity by calling our non-emergency number at 790-6800 and selecting option 3 or dialing 9-1-1. You can also text-a-tip by texting: Tip FremontPD followed by your message to 888777.

On a final note, we would also like to remind attendees that pets (all shapes and sizes) are not allowed at the event.

The Fremont Festival of the Arts is a multi-faceted, complex endeavor that we undertake every year. It's family-friendly, fun, and a massive undertaking for our small army of full-time workers and volunteers. Despite the immense amount of work needed to make the festival happen, it is absolutely worth it for us.

The Chamber's mission is to promote, support and enhance a positive business environment. The Festival does this by:

- Providing opportunities for our members: Each year, dozens of businesses take part in the Business Marketplace tradeshow at the Festival. It's a unique opportunity, open only to Chamber members, to reach hundreds of thousands of potential customers. Our Festival attendees come from all over the greater Bay Area, but the majority travel less than fifty miles to attend. This local customer base is a great resource for Chamber member businesses. Additionally, we source most of our vendors from the local business community.
- Bringing people and dollars into Fremont: The Festival is the biggest attraction for Fremont on an annual basis – it brings in

people like no other. Attendees come not only ready to spend money and enjoy the Festival, but also to stop and get a bite to eat after or do some shopping at Pacific Commons. The economic impact of the event is immense — the City of Fremont receives \$150,000 in sales tax revenue the weekend of the Festival each year. The Festival is an economic driver for the larger Fremont community.

- Provides an opportunity for local community organizations Non-profits at the Festival serve ice cream and burgers, clean up garbage, and assist in operations. All of these tasks give organizations a chance to raise funds for their programs. From Little League to Rotary, the Festival is a vehicle for community organizations to raise the money they need to make an impact in the community.
- Helps to keep the Chamber going The Festival provides revenue for the Chamber as well. As a membership organization, we survive based on dues from our members and revenue from programming. The revenue from the Festival helps us keep dues competitive and allows us to remain an independent organization.

If you are free on or before August 1st and 2nd, come visit us. I will have a volunteer task for you to do and you can serve the Fremont community as well.

Businesses shouldn't need a list of reasons why volunteering is good for the bottom line. However, here is a short one:

Engaging in activities that support your community can produce rewards for your business.

#1 Build and strengthen interpersonal relationships — Getting involved in a civic endeavor puts you in contact with people you might never meet otherwise. Some of these individuals will have knowledge and experience that may prove helpful to your business. They could even become valuable mentors or advisers.

#2 Create indirect marketing opportunities — The relationships you make as a volunteer can generate business simply through word of mouth. The people volunteering alongside you may need — or know others who need — your product or service. Once they get to know you and your offering, they can also recommend it to their

friends, family members, and colleagues.

#3 Strengthen your brand — A business engaged in volunteer work often finds its brand enhanced because of the reputation it gains from doing something beyond making a profit. People tend to remember (and buy) associated with community good will. Thus, promote your volunteer through contributions email newsletters, blog posts, and social media, and encourage readers to learn more about the charitable organizations involved.

#4 Expand your knowledge — Volunteer work offers insights into the needs of others while enabling you to grow as an individual. The increased empathy you develop for people in need also broadens your understanding of what your customers want and need.

- Staff your booth adequately so that you can take breaks and remain enthusiastic and energetic over the two days!
- Remember the Festival is the beginning. Follow-up on your leads after the Festival to turn them into customers and


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

## ACWD breaks ground on new seismically secure storage facilities

On Friday, May 30, the Alameda County Water District (ACWD) took another step to ensure water supply reliability in the event of an earthquake with the groundbreaking of the Appian Tank Seismic Upgrade Project in Union City.

Located just north of Mission Boulevard off Appian Way, the 770,000 gallon capacity water storage tank helps to maintain uniform water pressure and provides water for firefighting and other emergencies in the Union City area. In addition to replacing the tank, the project includes the replacement of several thousand feet of transmission lines, as well as improved monitoring and control

systems. The tank improvements are part of the District's overall Main Replacement and Seismic Upgrade Program — a larger program to seismically upgrade or retrofit water storage facilities and main lines that have been identified to be most seismically vulnerable.

The tank upgrade is scheduled for completion in October 2015.

## New Shoreline Campground in Fremont Coming


The Dumbarton Quarry will be a 91-acre regional park with more than 100 campsites, an amphitheater, event center,

restrooms and an expansive meadow with views of San Francisco Bay, the East Bay hills and the Peninsula.

The park will connect the 30,000-acre Don Edwards refuge with 980-acre Coyote Hills Regional Park, providing an important link in the San Francisco Bay Trail plus miles of hiking opportunities amid the wetlands and grassy hillsides of the southern East Bay shoreline.

The first phase, slated for completion in 2017, will include 63 RV campsite hook-ups, a picnic area, playground, amphitheater, restrooms and trails. The second phase, expected to be finished in 10 to 12 years, will include 30 car campsites, 17 walk-in campsites, an event center and the meadow.
